JCSP



TY C EXPERIENCES PUBLISHED UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF ENGLISH

CPR & First Aid Training in TY

TEACHER MS CUNNEEN

As part of our TY learning experience we got to learn how to do CPR, and how to recognise situations where we may need to perform it. Ms Cunneen and Ms Carr did the training with us in Room 18. The focus of the training was how to perform CPR correctly in the event of an emergency. We learned when doing chest compressions that you must place your dominant hand on top of your other hand and press hard into the person chest, about 2 inches deep. When doing this we learned to have the song 'staying alive' in your head and push on the beat of that. You must make sure the person is flat on the ground before performing chest compressions. If using a defibrillator you must ensure the person is unresponsive. Then remove the person's top clothing and stick the pads onto the person's chest. The defibrillator will analyse the person's heart rhythm and tell you what to do. If a child needs CPR you should look for no breathing or only gasping. Give 30 chest compressions, using one hand, and then do 2 breaths. Keep on repeating 30 compressions and 2 breaths.

We also learned about recognising the signs of a stroke. When you believe someone is experiencing a stroke you must recognise the signs; F.A.S.T. Face- their face begins to droop on one side. Arms- they loose strength in the arms and are unable to lift them properly. Speech- their speech becomes slurred.

Time- you must act fast and call 999.

We then learned about choking. If someone is choking, you must quickly ask, they will usually give the universal sign for choking. Then you must go behind them and wrap your arms around their stomach and push upwards.

I enjoyed learning how to perform CPR correctly, how to recognise situations when CPR is needed and the importance of knowing how to perform CPR correctly. This is a valuable life lesson for us all to have learned.

A few weeks ago, Maria Ryan and I were at the RDS in Dublin for the BT Young Scientist exhibition. It was an unforgettable experience, and it gave us an opportunity to express our interest in certain topics. Our project, "Behind the Smiles", is a project based around students who may have experienced burnout during their time in school and if it affected their mental health. The judges asked us questions, as if it was a normal conversation such as, "What is your project about?", "How did you go about doing your project?", "Did you run into any issues?". We were chosen to meet the President, Michael D. Higgins, which was very exciting and a great honour. We also met Simon Harris and we were given his business card to send our project to him. Although we didn't win anything, we're still so grateful to have been chosen and we're glad we got to express our concerns for the mental well-being of secondary school students. We were disappointed that students of CMCO couldn't attend the RDS to support us because of the weather, but we were grateful for the many messages of support we received.


